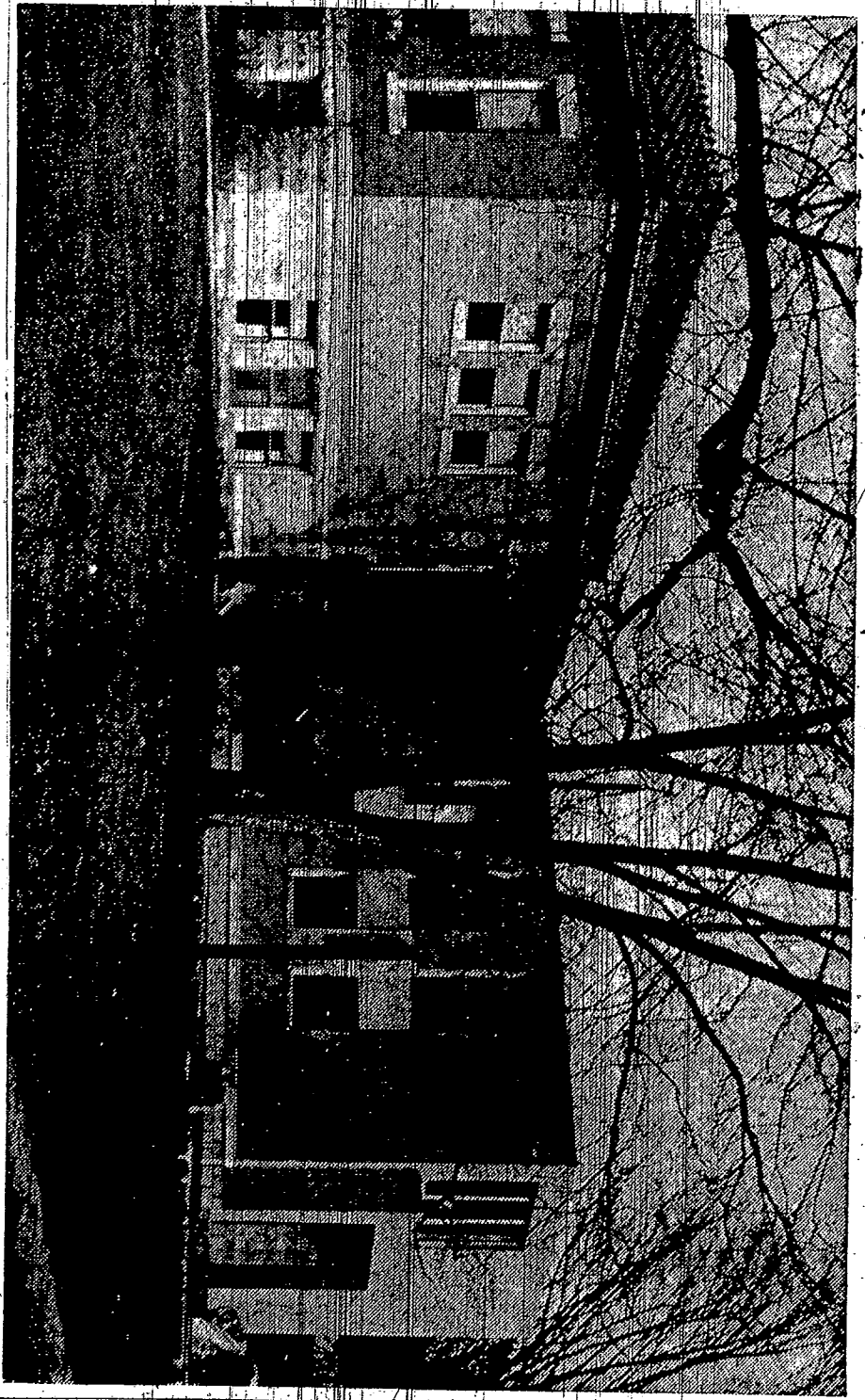

Ohio Idle Pay Claims Decline

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP)—There was a decrease in both new and continuing claims for unemployment compensation in the week ended April 15, the Bureau of Unemployment Compensation reported Wednesday.

New claims dropped from 22,724 listed for the week ended April 8 to 20,748. Continuing claims of those unemployed one week or more dropped from 203,669 to 197,652.

At the same time the bureau reported that initial claims for benefits in Ohio under the federal temporary extended unemployment compensation act for the week ended April 15 totaled 5,634, of which 31,806 were in metropolitan areas.

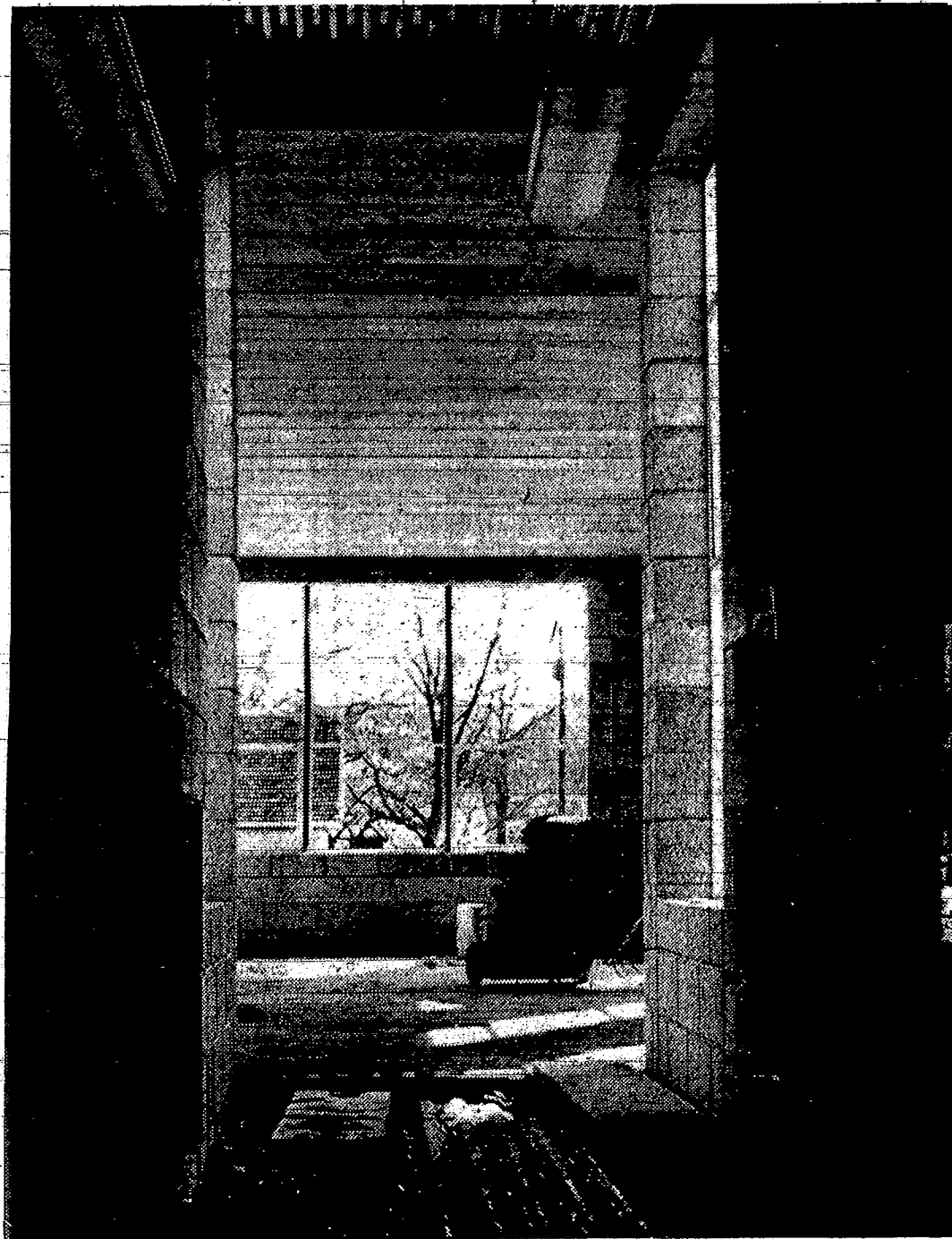

once-before expanded, Carnegie-founded institution, the addition will house an adult reading room, furnished with lounge chairs, settees and offering a display area for new books for browsing and reading, as well as providing periodicals.

reports that the building will answer a need for expansion. In the last four years, circulation has climbed 106 per cent and is continuing to climb this year.

On the ground-floor level, the addition will house a furnace room and a storage area for the library's bookmobile, which offers reading service throughout Clinton County.

The building is of concrete block construction with brick facing, constructed by Modern Sales and Construction, from plans prepared by Lethly Schreiber and Associates of Springfield.

The structure will cost approximately \$27,750, with monies from accumulations in the library building fund and a bequest by Mrs. Minnie Hadley.
